



Tokyo Festival 2018 to be held this fall

A performing arts festival in the Ikebukuro area of Toshima, entering in its third year Festival General Director Satoshi Miyagi and the "Planning Team" get started A diverse Japanese & international lineup announced for 2018

The Tokyo Festival Executive Committee (Chairman: Shigeo Fukuchi) is proud to present the Tokyo Festival, to be held mainly in the Ikebukuro area of Toshima, Tokyo, for 100 days from Saturday, September 1st, 2018 to Sunday, December 9th, 2018.

The Tokyo Festival, which was launched in 2016, celebrates its third year in 2018. This year will mark the first year of a new collaborative system between Festival General Director Satoshi Miyagi (Director of SPAC: Shizuoka Performing Arts Center) and members of the Tokyo Festival "Planning Team." A more comprehensive program will be developed, including implementation of projects directly managed by the Festival General Director.

Comment by Festival General Director Satoshi Miyagi

When a society becomes divided between vested interests—the "haves," as viewed by the majority—and those who feel dissatisfied and disenfranchised by those vested interests—the "have nots"—that society is headed for terrible tragedy. We have learned this lesson from history. But since it seems that humanity is trying to repeat this folly again, as a performing artist, I thought I could try to remedy this division in some small way through the Tokyo Festival.

Those who are interested in going to see theater in Tokyo nowadays are viewed by the majority who do not go to the theater as people with abundant means: a blessed few. And theatre makers who create work without awareness of this situation can also be regarded as belonging to the side of these vested interests. To address this crisis, first of all, I'd like to take action to open up the theater through this Tokyo Festival. As a symbolic project, by holding open-air performances in Ikebukuro's Nishiguchi Park, I hope to provide opportunities for audiences to encounter high-quality works at low cost.

On the other hand, we will also provide <u>refining</u> experiences by presenting a broad collection of cuttingedge works in Tokyo that proudly number among the best worldwide.

Thirdly, as we move toward the Olympic Games in 2020, there is concern in Japan that the nation's polarization toward Tokyo will accelerate even further. To ensure this festival revitalizes not only Tokyo but the entirety of Japan, our program seeks to ensure Tokyo is <u>connected</u> with Japan's regional areas.

Based on these three principles—<u>Open</u>, <u>Refining</u>, <u>Connecting</u>—I look forward to advancing the future of the Tokyo Festival.

What is the Tokyo Festival?

This is a comprehensive urban arts festival which aims to link the metropolis to the rest of the world through Tokyo's diverse arts and culture scene.



One of Italy's leading directors, Giorgio Barberio Corsetti, has held auditions in Ikebukuro for an outdoor performance of *The Threepenny Opera* to be performed at Ikebukuro's Nishiguchi Park, selecting all the performers personally. *The Glass Menagerie* by French director Daniel Jeanneteau is a huge hit, beautifully staged, that tells an ephemeral family story, as familiar as a nightmare. *Dark Circus* by French company Stereoptik is a low-tech, live art performance aimed at families that spins the darkly humorous tale of a catastrophic circus group. Aside from these, Festival General Director Satoshi Miyagi will present six works by Japanese and overseas artists selected for their <u>Open</u>, <u>Refining</u>, and <u>Connecting</u> practice. Audiences can partake of both programs at low cost.
